Dear Applicant:

We are pleased to inform you that upon review of your application for tax exempt status we have determined that you are exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. 4) **Please describe the purpose and intent of the grant.**
 Details of the proposed music lesson program are as follows:
