## Additional Information for May 17, 2023 Budget Committee Meeting

**Item 5.** Request to partially fund Congress of Neighborhoods. Initial suggested amount is \$1,500. However, any money unspent for this FY ending 6-30-23 in excess of \$10,000 will revert back to LA City. My best estimate of funds remaining ( in excess of \$10,000) after allocating all monies at tonight's meeting is \$4,300. This suggests that we could allocate up to \$5,800 without effecting our carryover of \$10,000.



## Help fund this year's Congress of Neighborhoods and our return to an in-person event at City Hall.

The Congress of Neighborhoods is planned by Neighborhood Councils for Neighborhood Councils. **The Congress is also funded by Neighborhood Councils.** 

## We can only raise the \$73,000 budget for this annual event with your help.

We are so excited to be returning to City Hall after three years of convening via Zoom! While costs for our virtual events were lower, we are now back to asking each Neighborhood Council to chip in to sponsor the 2023 Los Angeles Congress of Neighborhoods, "A New Era: Reimagining Leadership." It costs about \$70,000 each year to bring together our Neighborhood Councils for our annual conference. <u>Click here</u> to view this year's \$73,000 event budget. Some important notes:

- The LA City budget historically includes \$10,000 to offset the costs of hosting the Congress at City Hall (LAPD security, IT staff, maintenance staff, facility fees, etc.), **but that line item has been removed from the Mayor's proposed budget this year**, making NC sponsorships even more important this year.
- The Congress is a free event open to the public, so board members, committee members, and interested stakeholders are all welcome to participate.
- If each Neighborhood Council contributes \$1,000, our budget will be covered.

**Item 9.** Request to increase the budget for Name plates, business cards and name tags from \$350 to \$650.
