- **11.** Discussion and Motion: Resolved: The TNC Board approves the Executive Committee's recommendation to approve the payment of the encumbrance for an NPG for Tarzana Elementary School for \$3,825.00 for IXL Learning License.
- **12.** Discussion and motion: Resolved: The TNC Board approves the Executive Committee's recommendation to approve the payment of the encumbrance for an NPG for Portola Middle School for \$2,202.34 for 3 computers for their library.
- **13.** Discussion and motion: Resolved: The TNC Board approves the Executive Committee's recommendation to approve the payment of the encumbrance for an NPG for Southern California Preparedness Foundation for \$1,000 supporting their 13th Annual Valley Disaster Preparedness Fair

Discussion and motion: Resolved: The TNC Board adopts the Budget Committee's recommendation to approve an amended budget for the 2020-21 Fiscal Year to include as Revenue previously authorized Encumbrances of \$19,932.72 and a Rollover of \$3,652.13. In addition, to amend the Expense portion of the Budget in the amount of \$19,932.72 as follows: Outreach, Banners \$10,905.38; Outreach, Web Site Maintenance \$2,000; NPG, Tarzana

Discussion and motion: Resolved: The TNC Board approves the Executive Committee's recommendation to approve the payment of ongoing expenses as follows: For the fiscal year 2020-21, the TNC authorizes its Treasurer or other designee to pay previously budgeted recurring monthly or periodic expenses, in small amounts, defined as those not to exceed \$75/day for one item and expense classification category. These expenses include, but are not limited to, copies and postage for committees, Board and committee meetings, officers and committee chairperson expenses and etc., and, refreshments for meetings (other than Board meetings) and etc. The recurring expenses are AppleOne, or other temporary staffing agencies for preparation of minutes or other clerical functions not to exceed ("NTE") \$375/meeting, Net Atlantic or other such company for mailing list maintenance and distribution NTE \$45/month and The Web Corner or other such company for web site hosting and maintenance NTE \$150 for each month's services and the purchase of food and refreshments for Board meetings from any vendors NTE \$200 per meeting.
- **16.** Discussion and motion: Resolved: The TNC Board approves the Budget Committee's recommendation not to support the request from the Wilbur Charter for Enriched Academics for an NPG for \$2,000.00 to fund the cost of a Muralist to create campus murals.
- 17. Discussion and motion: Resolved: The TNC Board approves the Land Use Committee's recommendation to file a CIS in support of CM Ryu's motion, CF 20-0002-S101oppossing SB 1102. SB 1102 will negatively impact single family residential neighborhoods allowing uncontrollable increases in density. It will increase the need for services and infrastructure that cannot be funded by our city. We have no objection to increased density in currently zoned multifamily neighborhoods where the impact will be lessened.
- 18. Discussion and motion: Resolved: The TNC Board approves the Land Use Committee's recommendation to write a letter to CM Bob Blumenfield requesting he initiate a motion or motions to have the City Council officially oppose the following pending state legislative matters: SB 1085. SB 902, AB 725, SB 995, AB 1279 and AB 2345. These bills will essentially eliminate most single-family residential areas in Los Angeles. Combined they will severely impact the San Fernando Valley and South Los Angeles because of the major bus routes. These legislative proposals will also severely restrict the city's control over land use issues.
- **19.** Discussion and motion: Resolved: The TNC Board approves the Transportation Committee's recommendation to send a letter to the appropriate agency of the City, with a copy to CM Bob Blumenfield requesting the posting of one week's advance notice of repairs to major streets. Notice is to be posted at the periphery of the area to be repaired. The purpose is to prevent the need for drivers to turn around when they drive into a street undergoing repair
- **20.** Discussion and motion: Resolved: The TNC Board approves the Transportation Committee's recommendation not to request a stop sign at the intersection of east bound Wells Drive and west Casa Ave/
